

November 7, 2017 General Election in Pima County

The next General Election is November 7, with voting by mail in October. Registered voters in the City of Tucson, Town of Oro Valley, four local school districts, and three fire districts will be voting. Polls will be open in Oro Valley, but voting in all other locations will be by mail. Pima County will also have several early voting centers open for ballot drop-off.

October 9 is the deadline to register or update your voter registration for this election (if you have moved, or changed your name or political party). You can do this online or with a paper form.

- Citizens with an Arizona Driver's License or State ID can register to vote or update their voter registration at servicearizona.com, the Motor Vehicle Division website.
- Arizona Voter Registration Forms are available at libraries and from the Pima County Recorder's Office. Go to recorder.pima.gov/regvote, or call 520-724-4330 for forms or more information about registering to vote.

Registered voters in the City of Tucson will vote on these offices and issues:

- Tucson City Council Members for Wards 3, 5 and 6 (elected by all Tucson voters)
- Financial aid for eligible City of Tucson families to pay for preschool education (paid for by raising the sales tax one half of 1%)
- More funding for the Reid Park Zoo (paid for by raising the sales tax by one tenth of 1%)
- A pay raise for the Mayor and City Council members

Registered voters in Oro Valley will vote on selling bonds to pay for sports fields, playgrounds and other improvements at Naranja Park. For more information, go to orovalleyaz.gov/town/departments/town-clerk/town-elections.

Voters in Tucson (TUSD), Marana, Sunnyside and Flowing Wells School Districts will vote on funding for schools. For more information about these school district elections, go to schools.pima.gov/elections/november-2017-school-district-ballot-measures.

Drexel Heights, Picture Rock and Avra Valley Fire Districts will also have issues on the ballot.
