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The League of Women Voters will host a public meeting to learn about changes in our healthcare coverage. Local experts will present and take questions.

The League has asked the panelists to speak about care from the prospective of an aging population, new collaborative initiatives in Tucson concerning social determinates of health and end of life planning, health benefits and coverage.

Confirmed panelists include: W. Mark Clark, President and CEO of Pima Council on Aging, Nancy Johnson, RN, PhD, CEO, El Rio Community Health Center, and Julia Strange, Vice President for Community Benefit at Tucson Medical Center.

The meeting will be held on Saturday, January 20, 2018 beginning with light refreshments at 9:30 and the program at 10 a.m. It will be held at the headquarters of El Rio Community Health Center in the historic Manning House, 450 West Paseo Redondo.

“This is an important topic for all of us,” said Freda Johnson, president of the League of Women Voters of Greater Tucson. “It’s imperative we are all educated on services available to us and changes in those services that could impact our wellbeing.”
