### Tucson League of Women Voters Updates Publications in “Tucson Votes 2018” Campaign

- New “Guide to Voting” to help educate Pima County voters
- Updates to Directory of Elected Officials and Know Your Pima County handbooks provide new background for politically active public

The League of Women Voters of Greater Tucson (LWVGT), a non-partisan political organization encouraging informed and active participation in government, has just issued new reference publications for Pima County voters in preparation for the upcoming 2018 elections. The reference publications include a new *Guide to Voting* and updates to the *Directory of Elected Officials* and *Know Your Pima County* resources for citizens looking to become more informed in preparation for the upcoming elections.

A **Guide to Voting** (Guide) is a new document that incorporates information from several previously published pieces, integrating all essential information about voting in 2018 Pima County elections one place. The Guide includes information about everything from how and where to register to vote in Pima County to where to learn about candidates and issues to best practices during the actual act of voting.

The **Directory of Elected Officials** is a complete compilation of City, State, Federal, and Tribal offices and associated elected officials in Pima County. The Directory includes the name, elected office, contact information, and party affiliation for each elected official.

The **Know Your Pima County** handbook update includes clear, concise, and readable information about the past and present activities of Tribal, County, and Municipal government entities in Pima County, including Tribal Governments within County borders, incorporated and unincorporated areas; School and Special Taxing Districts; Inter-governmental Structures; and the County Judiciary.
