November 7th Tucson Ballot Proposition Pros/Cons

Voters in the City of Tucson will have the opportunity to decide the fate of four ballot propositions on the November 7th general election ballot.

As a public service to the community, the non-partisan League of Women Voters of Greater Tucson has studied the propositions and has issued a list of pros and cons on each one.

“This is one of the things the League does to help voters make educated decisions on the ballot,” said Freda Johnson, President of the League of Women Voters of

Greater Tucson. “We hope voters will take a few minutes to study the impact of each proposition.”

In the past, the League has, on occasion, taken a position on local propositions, but has decided not to do that this year.

Propositions 202 and 203 will increase the sales tax by .01% for ten years to provide additional funding to the Reid Park Zoo. Proposition 204 is called “Strong Start Tucson” and is a citizen initiative to raise the sales tax .05% to provide school scholarships to underprivileged children in Tucson. Proposition 406 provides for an increase in salary for the Mayor and members of the Tucson City Council.
